Stolen Doubles

It is really annoying when the opposition overcalls the suit that you were going to bid **as an artificial bid.** This is common after 1NT. Take this auction;

One defence against this type of interference is to double. It says that I would have bid an artificial bid of 2H's requiring you to transfer to spades. As the opposition has stolen your bid then it is called a STOLEN DOUBLE. In this example you can bid 2S to show an invitational hand with 5 spades.

You can also use the stolen double if the opposition bid 2C stealing your stayman bid. A double here would say I would have bid 2C if it were not for the b^{******} opposition.

The same applies if you had opened 2NT and the opposition bid 3C,D or H
